MMF Local By-law Consultation Townhall: Code of Conduct

(Virtual Consultations with Red River Métis Citizens)

Purpose

These consultations provide a safe, respectful space for Red River Métis Citizens to contribute their views on the MMF Constitution's Local By-Law. This Code of Conduct supports meaningful, inclusive, and accountable dialogue.

Participation

- Participation is open to Red River Métis Citizens.
- Participants must have a valid Citizenship Number (V#).
- Registration is required to attend.
- One link per registered participant.
 - Only Red River Métis Citizens who have registered through the official link may participate.
 - Please do not share your link
- Facilitators and moderators will guide the session and ensure balanced participation.
- By registering and joining, participants consent to the session being recorded and agree to abide by this Code of Conduct.

Respectful Engagement

- Comments must be on-topic, constructive, and made in good faith.
- Address all remarks to the facilitator—not to other participants.
- Disagreements are welcome and valued, but personal attacks, inflammatory language, or disruptions will not be tolerated.

Identity and Introduction

- When speaking, please begin with your name and Local affiliation (if known).
- Respect the confidentiality and views of others. Lived experiences and opinions may differ.

Technology and Environment

- Join from a quiet space, free of background noise. Use a working mic and camera (if possible).
- If technical issues arise, rejoin using the same link or notify the moderator.

Facilitation and Order

- Facilitators and moderators maintain order and may mute, remove, or bar participants who breach this Code.
- Participants will receive one warning before removal, unless conduct is egregious.
- There is no appeal process during the session. Concerns may be submitted in writing after the consultation.

Final Notes

This is a space for collaborative discussion. All participants are expected to contribute to an open, safe, and solutions-oriented dialogue that reflects the dignity of the Red River Métis and supports the development of the institutions of our National Government, the MMF.
